
THE ANIMAL WELFARE PROJECT ON FUR-FARMED SPECIES

Background

OD FEEDING - GOOD HOLLS IN Today our society is more and more interested in the origin of animal products, and therefore **modern** Wel Fur 600 Wel Fur 600 Well Fu **animal production has to be transparent**. Information on the welfare status of farm animals is an essential feature of this transparency. Before information on the welfare of the animals can be presented to the consumer and to the general public, there must be viable ways to collect reliable and valid data. During the period 2004-2009, the EU-funded Welfare Quality® project developed general principles and criteria for animal-welfare assessment at farm level: **good feeding**, **good housing**, **good health** and appropriate behaviour. Detailed welfare-assessment protocols have been published for cattle, pigs, laying hens and broiler chickens. They all have a firm scientific basis.

> Timeline

The kick-off meeting with the group of scientific experts took place in Helsinki.









> Aims

These WQ® protocols are species-specific and can be further developed provided that sufficient scientific knowledge on the biology and welfare of a species is available. Welfare of the most important fur-farmed animals, the mink (*Mustela vison*), the fox (*Alopex and Vulpes families*) and the finnraccoon (*Nyctereutes procyonoides*) has been scientifically studied over the last 25 years. The general objective of the **WelFur** project is to **set-up a welfare-quality-like project on fur-farmed animals**. The main outcome will be welfare-assessment protocols for the mink, the fox and the finnraccoon. The implementation of these protocols at farm level is within the scope of **WelFur**.

The welfare-assessment protocols for the mink, the fox and finnraccoon will be ready by the end of December.

The publication of the related scientific papers will take place at that time. The implementation phase at farm level will start immediately from 2011.
